## Transportation (T)

Prioritize investments where people live and work by maintaining, leveraging, and coordinating existing infrastructure when making investments.

Multi-modal transportation including transit, **pedestrian, and bicycle use**, become a larger share of all trips made in the region, resulting in **cleaner air** and **healthier communities**.

The region's transportation and infrastructure investments provide strategic access, linking residents, jobs, education, services, and other amenities.

Promote **policies that coordinate transportation and land use** and reduce the strain on **resources**.

Promote effective goods movement while improving **quality of life** for residents.

The region has **access** to global markets and destinations.
